Habitat- Small pine behind office building.

Behavior- When feeding, walked along main branches nuthatch style.

Description- Medium-sized warbler, with black and white stripes over wings and most of body. Large stripes on face and fine stripes on crown indicate that the individual was a male.

Voice- A high pitched see repeated about 10 times on same pitch. Medium volume, inaudible over lawn mower.

Similar species- Black-throated Gray and Blackpoll warblers do not have striped wings or walk on large branches.

Experience- Extensive experience by both observers on Texas coast May 1980.
