BROWN THRASHER

Portland, Oregon

In early September 1987, Mrs. Edna Palmer, 7335 S.E. Woodstock, Portland, Oregon, brought a frozen dead Brown Thrasher to the Portland Audubon Society offices in Portland. The bird was photographed, then given to Portland State University for preparation and inclusion into the Portland State collection. 97206

Mrs. Palmer states that during the evening of June 6, 1987, she observed the thrasher crawl under the garden gate into her yard, then creep across the lawn to the water sprinkler. The next morning she found the bird dead near the sprinkler head. Identifying it as a Brown Thrasher she placed it in the freezer and later gave it to Portland Audubon.

This individual was a typical Brown Thrasher, reddish-brown above with heavy brown streaks on the whitish underparts. It was about robin sized with a long tail and long rather thin bill, slightly decurved; two rather distinct wing bars and slightly grayish about the face. It had light yellowish eyes so apparently was full adult.
