This bird was found by Gary S. Lester about 12:30pm and was located by song. I refound the bird at 6:30pm by its repeated high see, see, see, see song high in the Sitka Spruce trees. I saw it twice very well but briefly, Once in flight and the other time sat facing me as in my sketch and sang. I was about 50 ft. away with 8X B&W Elites.

It was a pretty male; dark cap, rufous auricular patch with yellow eyebrow, throat, breast and rear side of head patch. Breast was streaked with black as my sketch. Nape & back greenish, wings showed white wing bars the uppers being bolder. I was in the area for about 1/2 hour during which the bird was singing continually.
