

CHESTNUT-SIDED WARBLER
September 24 and 25, 1982
Fields, Harney Co., Oregon
Observers: Jeff Gilligan, Richard Smith, Owen Schmidt

Birding in the shrubs in front of the motel in Fields, Gilligan and Smith flushed an immature **Chestnut-sided Warbler** into view. It was a windy day and so birds were generally deep in the vegetation, but once flushed the bird remained off and on in view for some time. The immature of this species is unmistakable: bright green back, something of a lemon-green, brightest on the cap, but bright on the nape, hind neck, back and upper tail coverts; nearly pure white on all the underparts, but a slightly dingy breastband; dark wings with two conspicuous cream-colored wingbars; distinct white eye ring.

The photographs are conclusive.
