2. Chestnut-sided Warbler, one adult male in full breeding plumage.
3. June 26, 1995, 10:30 a.m.
4. Fields Oasis, inside the dike, near the birder's bench. The bird was moving through the trees 10 to 30 feet above the ground.
5. The bird was immediately recognized as a warbler. Yellow crown, white cheek patch, black eye line, black whisker stripe, chestnut sides, white underparts, two pale wing bars (outer wing bar wider), dark upperparts, were all observed. Unmistakable! The bird was observed moving through the trees. It was also singing. The singing attracted the attention of a resident Yellow Warbler which drove the Chestnut-sided Warbler away after approximately 5 minutes.  
The bird was also observed by Dave and Dave from Vancouver. The younger Dave had the National Geographic Field Guide immediately at hand. The observation was made in good light at 30 to 50 feet. All three of us had binoculars on the bird.
