of Brookings, Curry County, Oregon

Habitat: willows/blackberries along ocean beach

Details: I observed subject bird flycatching in an area where a Black Phoebe often is. Almost passed it off as a Black Phoebe until I noticed the yellowish underparts and subtle wing bars. I was approaching the beach from a steep hillside (above bird) as a group of people approached on the beach. I managed to get a few quick photos before the bird flew to an inaccessible area.

Vocalization: No vocalization was heard.

No field guide was used due to previous experience with the species.

No other observers were present.
