WE FIRST DETECTED THIS BIRD BY ITS SONG COMING FROM THE "NEW" GROWTH OF A TOPPED SILVER MAPLE. AFTER FINDING THIS BIRD WE WATCHED IT FOR ALMOST AN HOUR. MERRY LYNN TOOK SEVERAL PHOTOS, TWO ARE WITH THIS REPORT. THIS WAS A BREEDING PLUMAGED MALE THAT WAS TRYING TO ESTABLISH A TERRITORY. THIS BIRD SANG A HIGH BUZZY TRILL REPEATEDLY. WE HAVE SEEN THIS SPECIES IN TEXAS, OREGON, MARYLAND. WE WERE

10'-50' FROM THIS BIRD, IN EXCELLANT-GOOD LIGHT 10X 48X BINOCLS -ML PHOTOED THIS BIRD (ENCLOSED) THIS BRIGHT MALE SHOWED A GREEN MANTLE YELLOW THROAT & A DARK & A RUST BAND.

NOTE: THIS INDIVIDUAL HAD A WIDER DARK NECK BAND THAN MOST.
