1 1/2 miles SE of Cape Blanco, Curry County

I first noticed this bird flycatching from a powerline. It had a very lemon-yellow breast color that extended almost to the throat. A brown, notched tail and it's back was olive/green depending on the light. Also of note was a fairly large dark bill. We watched this bird for about a total of 5 minutes but could never hear it give a call note. No photos were taken.

Bill- large and dark  
Belly- bright yellow and extending high on the breast.  
Cap- gray  
Back-green/olive  
Tail- brown and notched, no white.
